

With over 350 in attendance, Ms. Ziering sparked a dialogue about institutional rape on college campuses. That same evening, and to celebrate our 20th anniversary, we recognized 20 Unsung Sheroes and Heros who work quietly and behind the scenes to improve the lives of women. In late August we hosted the 20th Annual Celebration of Women and combined it with Shirley's farewell to the community in her role as Executive Director.

The Women's Center was proud to count among its 2014-2015 accomplishments the following recognition: Mental Health America awarded us the Best Small Agency of the Year: The Ripple Effect. The Non-Profit Center for Northeast Florida gave the agency the Local Focus: Lasting Impact award for Innovative Programming for the Sexual Assault Forensic Exam (SAFE) Program, and Shirley was the proud recipient of the Lifetime Achievement Award from the Women Business Owners.

Services AND PROGRAMS

RAPE RECOVERY TEAM

The Rape Recovery Team served 712 primary and secondary clients face to face and 2,156 primary and secondary survivors were served on the hotline. Sexual Assault Nurse Examiners conducted 292 forensic exams for survivors. Because of our increased advocacy work in Baker and Nassau Counties, the number of clients served in Baker County doubled in 2015 and tripled in Nassau County. All services are available to victims who report or choose not to report to the police. 160 adult outreach prevention education presentations were made and 148 youth prevention education presentations were made.

I will be forever thankful to the Women's Center of Jacksonville for their assistance in my recovery. They more than succeed in their mission to rehabilitate and encourage victims of violent crime, helping them become strong and confident survivors.


MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELING

Our counseling program, one of the only gender-responsive, trauma-informed sources of counseling for women and older girls served 480 clients. Services were provided to women with mental health needs ranging from survivors of childhood sexual abuse and survivors of recent sexual violence to family issues including divorce, custody and employment.




CLIENTS BY INCOME RANGE*

CLIENTS BY GENDER*





Services AND PROGRAMS

COMMUNITY EDUCATION

Advocacy, support and education focused on women's and girls' issues including:

Girls Circles

A national program for girls (age 9-18 years) offers structured support circle groups. Nine Girls Circles served 52 girls. Each circle has its own theme and the use of non-traditional techniques paired with the Girls Circle proven curriculum promotes confidence, competence and connectedness in a safe and structured environment for girls of all socio-economic backgrounds. Activities encourage girls to make wise and healthy choices as they advance through their teen years.

Expanded Horizons

Adult learning classes provide one-on-one tutoring and small group instruction. The Expanded Horizons program utilized 26 volunteer tutors to help over 100 women become more literate, achieve their GED, enroll in college, learn English as a second language, or become proficient on a computer.

Bosom Buddies

The Bosom Buddies program provided 46 support group meetings to women diagnosed with breast cancer; provided 28 clients with bras, head coverings, wigs and prostheses; and staffed eleven community wide events and health fairs. Remission Rocks, a community volunteer annual fundraising event, had the largest attendance in 5 years bringing not only the highest revenue but significantly increased awareness.

Women Renewed Employment Reentry

The Women Renewed Reentry program for female ex-offenders served 142 clients of which 114 women completed the program and 47 gained employment. The program provides wrap-around services to support the whole woman while she transitions from prison to society and back to her family. Services include mental health counseling, case management and employment counseling.

Services AND PROGRAMS

COMMUNITY EDUCATION (CONT.)

Community Events

Approximately 3,300 participants attended community events presented by the Women's Center throughout the year. Events included Equal Pay Day, *Women, Words & Wisdom* Speaker Event, Remission Rocks for Bosom Buddies, Champagne and Chocolate donor appreciation, Sexual Assault Awareness Month events, and the 20th Annual Celebration of Women.

INFORMATION AND REFERRAL

The Women's Center of Jacksonville received and referred 750 information and referral calls to individuals in need.

VOLUNTEERS

A total of 118 volunteers provided 11,000 volunteer hours

Rape Recovery Team:

22 volunteers provided 4,787 volunteer hours

Counseling:

3 volunteers provided 2,587 volunteer hours

Community Education:

38 volunteers provided 1,962 volunteer hours

Administration and Development:

55 volunteers provided 1,664 volunteer hours
